POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

PATROL ACTIVITY

OFFICERS MADE A VARIETY OF ARRESTS IN FEBRUARY INCLUDING WEAPONS CHARGES, DUI'S, PROSTITUTION, DOMESTIC AND SIMPLE BATTERY, SOLICITATION OF A SEXUAL ACT, AND MULTIPLE FELONIES FOR BEING AN ARMED HABITUAL OFFENDER, AGGRAVATED UNLAWFUL USE OF A WEAPON BY A FELON, POSSESSION OF COCAINE AND FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING WITH A REVOKED LICENSE. ONE ARREST BY THIS AGENCY LED TO ANOTHER AGENCY CLEARING MULTIPLE FELONY CASES FOR AGGRAVATED VEHICULAR HIJACKING WHERE THE OFFENDER TOOK VEHICLES AT GUNPOINT FROM HIS VICTIMS.

OFFICERS ANSWERED 402 CALLS FOR SERVICE INCLUDING THEIR SELF INITIATED ACTIVITY. VARIOUS CALLS INCLUDED A FICTITIOUS RAPE, DOMESTIC BATTERIES, ASSISTING 13 MOTORISTS, BURGLARY, THEFTS AND 5 FOR DISTURBANCES OR FIGHTS. 182 TRAFFIC STOPS WERE MADE AND 57 REPORTS WERE TAKEN.

SGT. WASEK MADE A TRAFFIC STOP ON A VEHICLE WITH AN UNREADABLE PAPER REGISTRATION IN THE REAR WINDSHIELD AND FOR MAKING A LANE CHANGE WITHOUT SIGNALING. THE DRIVER GAVE FICTITIOUS INFORMATION REGARDING HIS IDENTITY WHICH CAME BACK WITH NO RECORD, INDICATING THAT IDENTITY GIVEN HAD NEVER BEEN ISSUED A LICENSE. THE DRIVER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR DRIVING WITHOUT A LICENSE. A LOADED .38

CALIBER REVOLVER WAS LOCATED IN THE SUBJECT'S WAISTBAND. DURING A SEARCH OF HIS PERSON, 3 SMALL BAGS OF A ROCKLIKE SUB-

STANCE WERE LOCATED IN A POCKET. THE SUBSTANCE TESTED POSITIVE FOR COCAINE (CRACK). A LARGE PLASTIC BAG WAS ALSO RECOVERED CONTAINING 18 SMALL ZIPLOCK BAGS OF PLANT MATERIAL WHICH TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. INSIDE THE VEHICLE, A BOX CONTAINING 48 ROUNDS OF .38 CALIBER AMMUNITION WAS LOCATED. THE SUBJECT REFUSED TO PROVIDE ANY INFORMATION REGARDING HIS TRUE IDENTITY AND WAS FINGER-PRINTED FOR IDENTIFICATION. WHEN HIS TRUE IDENTITY WAS LEARNED, A CRIMINAL HISTORY WAS RUN WHICH INDICATED THE SUBJECT WAS A CONVICTED FELON WHO WAS WANTED BY THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR A PAROLE VIOLATION. THE STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WAS CONTACTED AND DUE TO HIS PREVIOUS FELONY CONVICTIONS THE SUBJECT WAS CHARGED WITH MULTIPLE FELONIES INCLUDING ARMED HABITUAL OFFENDER, AGGRAVATED UNLAWFUL USE OF A WEAPON BY A FELON AND POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE (COCAINE). HE WAS ALSO CHARGED WITH MULTIPLE MISDEMEANOR AND TRAFFIC CHARGES INCLUDING HAVING A REVOKED LICENSE, POSSESSION OF CANNABIS, POSSESSION OF AMMUNITION WITHOUT A FIREARM'S OWNER ID, AND ATTEMPTED OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE. IT WAS LEARNED THAT CALUMET CITY P.D. WAS LOOKING FOR THE SUBJECT RELATED TO AGGRAVATED VEHICULAR HIJACKINGS OUT OF THEIR TOWN. HE WAS TURNED OVER TO CALUMET CITY P.D. WHICH LED TO THEM CLEARING FELONY CASES OF AGGRAVATED VEHICULAR HIJACKINGS FOR VEHICLES TAKEN AT GUNPOINT.

OFFICERS TULEY AND GIANNINI WERE DISPATCHED TO A DOMESTIC PROBLEM AND UPON ARRIVAL LOCATED ONE OF THE INVOLVED PARTIES LEAVING IN A VEHICLE. THE FEMALE SUBJECT HAD COME TO HER EX-HUSBAND'S RESIDENCE AND STARTED A LOUD ARGUMENT OVER VISITING HER SON. SHE WAS ASKED TO LEAVE AND REFUSED UNTIL SHE LEARNED THE POLICE WERE BEING CALLED. HER VEHICLE WAS

STOPPED TO SPEAK WITH ALL PARTIES INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT. THE VEHICLE HAD MULTIPLE OCCUPANTS AND A CHECK WAS RUN ON ALL PARTIES INVOLVED. ALTHOUGH THE INCIDENT TURNED OUT TO BE ONLY A VERBAL ARGUMENT, IT WAS LEARNED THAT TWO OF THE VEHICLE OCCUPANTS INCLUDING THE WOMAN WHO STARTED THE DISTURBANCE WERE BOTH WANTED. ONE HAD A WARRANT OUT OF CHICAGO HEIGHTS AND THE OTHER WAS WANTED OUT OF THE CASS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. BOTH WERE TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND LATER RELEASED ON BOND.

SGT. MRJENOVICH AND OFFICER NOVAK WERE DISPATCHED TO A LOCAL MOTEL FOR A RAPE VICTIM. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS MET TWO FEMALE SUBJECTS IN AN UPPER FLOOR HALLWAY WHO RELATED THEY HAD BEEN RAPED BY A MALE STAYING ON THAT FLOOR. WHILE SPEAKING WITH THE FEMALES, THEY GAVE CONFLICTING STORIES. THEY WERE CONFRONTED WITH THE DISCREPANCIES AND THEN ONE SAID SHE WANTED TO TELL THE TRUTH. SHE THEN STATED THAT THEY WERE NOT RAPED, BUT WERE MAD BECAUSE THEY WERE HIRED TO HAVE SEX WITH THE MALE AND HE DID NOT PAY THEM. BOTH SUBJECTS WERE TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. SGT. MRJENOVICH THEN WENT TO THE ROOM AND SPOKE WITH THE MALE WHO ALSO STATED HE HAD HIRED THE FEMALES FROM THEIR ADVERTISEMENT ON CRAIG'S LIST TO HAVE SEX WITH HIM FOR MONEY. ALL PARTIES AGREED THAT THE SEX ACTS WERE PERFORMED FOR MONEY BUT THE MALE HAD NOT PAID AS AGREED. HE WAS ALSO TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. AT THE STATION ALL PARTIES GAVE STATEMENTS THAT THERE WAS NEVER A RAPE COMMITTED AND THAT THE FEMALES WERE PROSTITUTES AND THE MALE HAD HIRED THEM. THE MALE WAS CHARGED WITH SOLICITATION OF A SEXUAL ACT AND BOTH FEMALES WERE CHARGED WITH PROSTITUTION AND LATER BONDED.

SGT. WASEK STOPPED A PICKUP FOR MAKING AN

IMPROPER TURN AND HAVING REGISTRATION THAT EXPIRED IN 2006. HE REQUESTED THE DRIVER PRODUCE A LICENSE AND HE COULD ONLY PROVIDE A STATE I/D. A CHECK ON HIS LICENSE STATUS INDICATED HIS LICENSE WAS REVOKED AND HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. A PASSENGER IN THE VEHICLE WAS RUN AND IT WAS LEARNED HE HAD A \$90,000.00 WARRANT OUT OF CHICAGO P.D. HE WAS ALSO TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. A REVIEW OF THE DRIVER'S LICENSE HISTORY INDICATED HE HAD MULTIPLE CONVICTIONS FOR DRIVING WITH A LICENSE THAT WAS REVOKED FOR D.U.I. THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING WITH A REVOKED LICENSE, IMPROPER TURN, NO VALID REGISTRATION AND NO INSURANCE. BOTH SUBJECTS WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE MARKHAM COURT FOR BOND HEARINGS.

OFFICERS DRAKE AND ANDERSON WERE DISPATCHED TO A DOMESTIC SITUATION. UPON ARRIVAL, THEY SPOKE WITH THE VICTIM WHO RELATED SHE WANTED TO LEAVE THE RESIDENCE WITH HER BABY BECAUSE SHE FEARED FOR HER SAFETY. HER BOYFRIEND GRABBED HER BELONGINGS SHE WAS TRYING TO LEAVE WITH, THREW THEM ACROSS THE ROOM AND THEN BLOCKED THE DOORWAY SO SHE COULD NOT LEAVE. SHE TRIED TO PHONE THE POLICE AND THE OFFENDER TOOK HER PHONE FROM HER SO SHE COULD NOT COMPLETE THE CALL. THE OFFENDER WAS VERY INTOXICATED AND VERBALLY ABUSIVE TO THE VICTIM AND OFFICERS. THE OFFENDER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. THE VICTIM SIGNED A COMPLAINT AND HE WAS CHARGED WITH INTERFERENCE WITH THE REPORTING OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SENT TO THE MARKHAM COURT FOR A BOND HEARING.

OFFICER KEN VALLOW WAS DISPATCHED TO A RESIDENCE FOR A BATTERY COMPLAINT. UPON ARRIVAL, HE LEARNED THAT THE TWO PARTIES HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN A TRAFFIC CRASH IN BURNHAM AND THE VICTIM FOLLOWED THE OFFENDER HOME TO EAST HAZEL CREST AND CONFRONTED HER. THE OFFENDER THEN PUNCHED

THE VICTIM IN THE FACE AND PULLED HER HAIR. THE OFFENDER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. THE VICTIM SIGNED A COMPLAINT AND THE OFFENDER WAS CHARGED WITH BATTERY AND RELEASED AFTER POSTING BOND.

OFFICER NOVAK STOPPED A VEHICLE AFTER OBSERVING IT CROSS THE LANE STRIPING AND MAKE A LANE CHANGE WITHOUT SIGNALING. HE INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP AND SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER DETECTING A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE EMITTING FROM THE DRIVER. HE ASKED THE DRIVER HOW MUCH HE HAD TO DRINK. THE DRIVER REPLIED HE DRANK 18 BEERS AND THEN PRODUCED ONLY AN I/D CARD. THE DRIVER TRIED AND FAILED ALL FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR D.U.I. AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE SUBJECT TOOK A BREATH TEST WHICH INDICATED A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT (B.A.C.) OF .154. A CHECK ON HIS LICENSE STATUS INDICATED HE HAD NEVER OBTAINED A DRIVERS LICENSE. HE WAS CHARGED WITH IMPROPER LANE USAGE, FAILURE TO SIGNAL, NO VALID LICENSE, NO INSURANCE, DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL AND HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08. HE WAS RELEASED AFTER POSTING BOND.

SGT. MRJENOVICH OBSERVED AN SUV TRAVELING WITH APPROXIMATELY HALF THE VEHICLE IN EACH OF TWO LANES. THE VEHICLE RETURNED TO ITS LANE AND THEN CROSSED THE LANE STRIPING AT LEAST THREE MORE TIMES. A TRAFFIC STOP WAS MADE AND THE DRIVER WAS ASKED TO PRODUCE HIS LICENSE. A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE WAS DETECTED EMITTING FROM HIS PERSON AS HE SPOKE. UPON EXITING THE VEHICLE, THE DRIVER SWAYED AS HE WALKED AND WAS THEN ASKED TO PERFORM FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS. HE FAILED ALL THE TESTS ATTEMPTED AND ONE TEST HAD TO BE STOPPED FOR FEAR THE DRIVER WOULD FALL AND INJURE HIMSELF. HE SUBMITTED A BREATH SAMPLE INTO A PORTABLE BREATH TESTER WHICH INDICATED A B.A.C. OF .173. HE

WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR D.U.I. AT THE STATION, THE SUBJECT REFUSED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST AND WAS TRANSPORTED TO THE HOSPITAL WHERE HE SUPPLIED BLOOD FOR ANALYSIS. HE WAS CHARGED WITH MULTIPLE COUNTS OF IMPROPER LANE USAGE AND DRIV-

ING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. HE WAS RELEASED AFTER POSTING BOND. HE FACES AN ADDITIONAL CHARGE PENDING FOR HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08 AFTER THE LAB ANALYSIS COMES BACK ON THE BLOOD SAMPLES SUBMITTED.

INVESTIGATION REPORT

THE DETECTIVES OF THE EAST HAZEL CREST POLICE DEPARTMENT HAVE APPROXIMATELY 12 OPEN INVESTIGATIONS FOR THE YEAR 2009, AND 20 ACTIVE CASES FROM 2008. THESE INVESTIGATIONS BEING HANDLED INCLUDE BATTERY, ROBBERY, BURGLARY (RESIDENTIAL AND TO MOTOR VEHICLE), THEFT AND CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY.

THESE CASES HAVE PUT INVESTIGATORS IN CONTACT WITH INVESTIGATORS FROM THE AREA IN AN ATTEMPT TO GAIN INFORMATION, INCREASE NETWORKING CAPABILITIES AND TO CONDUCT FOLLOW UP INTERVIEWS, INVESTIGATIONS AND ARRESTS.

A RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY WAS REPORTED TO HAVE OCCURRED IN THE 17200 BLOCK OF HAWTHORNE. A WITNESS REPORTED OBSERVING A MALE SUBJECT LOOKING INTO THE RESIDENT'S WINDOWS AND THEN FORCING OPEN THE REAR DOOR. THE SUSPECT FLED THE SCENE PRIOR TO POLICE ARRIVAL. LEADS ARE BEING FOLLOWED UP AND THIS INVESTIGATION IS ON-GOING.

TWO STORAGE UNITS WERE BURGLARIZED AT THE PUBLIC STORAGE. ONE UNIT HAD SEVERAL ITEMS TAKEN FROM IT. THE OTHER SPACE HAD A TRAILER STOLEN FROM IT.

A VEHICLE WAS DISCOVERED TO HAVE BEEN BURGLARIZED AT THE SUPER 8 HOTEL. THE VICTIM FOUND HIS WINDOW BROKEN OUT AND A RADAR DETECTOR UNIT MISSING. THAT SAME NIGHT A VEHICLE WAS DISCOVERED TO HAVE

BEEN BROKEN INTO ON WOODED PATH. THE WITNESS SCARED OFF THE OFFENDERS BEFORE THEY COULD TAKE ANYTHING. THE OFFENDERS FLED THE SCENE IN A BLACK FORD FOCUS. INVESTIGATION ON-GOING.

A THEFT FROM A PURSE WAS REPORTED AT THE ECONOMY INN. THE VICTIM SAID SHE FELL ASLEEP IN THE ROOM WITH THE SUSPECT. BUT WHEN SHE WOKE UP THE SUSPECT AND THE VICTIM'S MONEY WERE MISSING. CURRENTLY WE ARE TRYING TO LOCATE THE SUSPECT.

A VICTIM REPORTED WHILE HE WAS WALKING N/B WOOD STREET AT 174TH STREET THE OFFENDER APPROACHED THE VICTIM FROM BEHIND AND STOLE THE VICTIM'S I-POD RIGHT OUT FROM HIS COAT POCKET. THE OFFENDER THEN FLED ON FOOT. THE VICTIM KNOWS THE OFFENDER'S IDENTITY AND DID NOT WISH ANY PROSECUTORIAL ACTION.

THE SUSPECT IN A RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY INVESTIGATION THAT OCCURRED IN NOVEMBER 2008 WAS ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH HIS INVOLVEMENT FOR THIS CRIME. THE BURGLARY OCCURRED IN THE 900 BLOCK OF 174TH STREET. THE VICTIM REPORTED MONEY AND PERSONAL CHECKS WERE FOUND MISSING FROM HIS RESIDENCE. LATER THE CHECKS WERE DEPOSITED INTO SEVERAL SUBJECTS PERSONAL BANKING ACCOUNTS. AN ARREST WARRANT IS FORTHCOMING FOR AN AT LARGE SUSPECT WHO CONTINUES TO FAIL TO COOPERATE WITH THE INVESTIGATION.

FEBRUARY ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED INCIDENT COMMAND 300—INTERMEDIATE INCIDENT COMMAND FOR EXPANDING INCIDENTS TRAINING. THIS COURSE IS MANDATED TRAINING ON THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

ON FEBRUARY 12 CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE IRMA POLICE CHIEF STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING IN HANOVER PARK. THAT AFTERNOON THE CHIEF AND ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT CAROL BOUQUET ATTENDED A JOINT 9-1-1 BOARD MEETING IN LYNWOOD. A VIDEO CONFERENCE WAS HELD WITH OUR RECORDS VENDOR TO DEMONSTRATE PRODUCT UPGRADES.

COOK COUNTY PROJECT SHIELD UPGRADED OUR SECOND VEHICLE TO THE PHASE 3 EQUIPMENT.

CHIEF ROBERTSON AND ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT CAROL BOUQUET ATTENDED AN IDOT "YOU DRINK, YOU DRIVE, YOU LOSE" LUNCHEON ON FEBRUARY 25. IDOT PROVIDED THIS LUNCH FOR ANY DEPARTMENT THAT PARTICIPATED IN A CHRISTMAS/NEW YEAR'S ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM. THE DEPARTMENT WON A PORTABLE BREATH TEST INSTRUMENT IN A PRIZE RAFFLE AT THE MEETING.

ON FEBRUARY 26 CHIEF ROBERTSON MET WITH A SMALL GROUP OF CHIEFS WHO CONTINUE TO TRY TO ADDRESS ISSUES IN THE MARKHAM COURT. THIS MEETING WAS WITH NEW STATES ATTORNEY ANITA ALVAREZ AND SOME OF HER KEY STAFF.

ALSO, ON FEBRUARY 26 CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE SOUTH SUBURBAN CHIEFS GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING AT GAELIC PARK IN OAK FOREST. LATER THAT AFTERNOON CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED A GOTOMEETING.COM CONFERENCE MEETING WITH LEXIPOL ON THE NEW POLICY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM WE RECENTLY PURCHASED.

DURING THE MONTH ALL OFFICERS WERE TO

COMPLETE BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS ANNUAL TRAINING AND HAZMAT REFRESHER COURSE COMPUTER BASED TRAINING. WE HAD SIGNIFICANT TECHNOLOGY ISSUES WITH BOTH PROGRAMS AND CONTINUE TO WORK ON THE TRAINING. ALL OFFICERS ARE ALSO IN THE PROCESS OF COMPLETING NIMS ICS-800 COMPUTER BASED TRAINING. WHEN COMPLETED IN MARCH ALL OFFICERS WILL HAVE COMPLETED ALL FOUR REQUIRED NIMS TRAINING COURSES.

AS PRESENTED AT THE FEBRUARY 11 BOARD MEETING THE AUTOMATED RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT CONTINUES TO MOVE ALONG. RED SPEED ILLINOIS DID RESUBMIT ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS TO IDOT ON FEBRUARY 15.

CHIEF ROBERTSON SUBMITTED ALL NECESSARY PAPERWORK TO THE STATE OF ILLINOIS CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR ILLINOIS WIRELESS INFORMATION NETWORK SERVICES. ONCE COMPLETED WE WILL SWITCH OUR MOBILE DATA SERVICE TO IWIN TO ACHIEVE BETTER SERVICE AND SAVE APPROXIMATELY \$30.00 PER MONTH.

OFFICER NOVAK ATTENDED THE MONTHLY SOUTH SUBURBAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM TRAINING ON FEBRUARY 23 AND 24. HE ALSO RESPONDED TO A TEAM ACTIVATION FOR A HIGH RISK SEARCH WARRANT FOR WEAPONS IN CALUMET CITY.

OFFICER TULEY ATTENDED A 40-HOUR BASIC INVESTIGATIVE SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAM.

ALL OFFICERS ATTENDED A 6-HOUR TASER REFRESHER COURSE. THE NEW TASERS WERE THEN DEPLOYED AND ARE BEING CARRIED BY ALL OFFICERS.

DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY EMPLOYEES USED 15 DAYS OF VACATION TIME AND 2 DAYS OF PERSONAL TIME.

STEPPED UP SPEED ENFORCEMENT RESUMES

DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH OFFICERS WILL RESUME EXTRA PATROLS TO ENFORCE SPEED RELATED VIOLATIONS AIMED TO REDUCE SPEED RELATED ACCIDENTS. THESE EXTRA PATROLS ARE FUNDED BY A GRANT FROM THE NATIONAL HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SAFETY ADMINISTRATION, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND ADMINISTERED BY THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

SPEEDING IS ONE OF THE MOST PREVALENT CONTRIBUTING FACTORS IN TRAFFIC CRASHES. ALCOHOL INVOLVEMENT IS PREVALENT FOR DRIVERS INVOLVED IN SPEED RELATED CRASHES. IT HAS BEEN SHOWN THAT HIGHLY VISABLE ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS FOCUSING ON THESE VIOLATIONS OFFER THE GREATEST POTENTIAL FOR CHANGING THESE BEHAVIORS.
