POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

PATROL ACTIVITY

OFFICERS ANSWERED 411 CALLS DURING JUNE INCLUDING 10 DISTURBANCES, 5 DOMESTIC PROBLEMS AND 7 TRAFFIC CRASHES INCLUDING A HIT AND RUN WHERE THE SUSPECT WAS LATER LOCATED AND ARRESTED. 90 REPORTS WERE GENERATED. TWO MISSING JUVENILES WERE REPORTED, LOCATED AND RETURNED HOME.

A VARIETY OF ARRESTS WERE MADE INCLUDING DOMESTIC BATTERY, ASSAULT, LEAVING THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT, DUI, DISORDERLY CONDUCT, 25 UNLICENSED DRIVERS, MULTIPLE PROSTITUTION AND PIMPING ARRESTS AND A FELONY FOR BURGLARY. OFFICERS SERVED 9 WARRANTS THIS MONTH. OFFICERS STOPPED 28 SUSPICIOUS SUBJECTS OR VEHICLES AND MADE 165 TRAFFIC STOPS.

TRUCK ENFORCEMENT GENERATED POTENTIAL FINES OF \$15,467.00.

SGT. MRJENOVICH AND OFFICER SZOLTYSIK WERE DISPATCHED TO A CALL OF A SUSPICIOUS SUBJECT WALKING IN THE RAIN AND LOOKING INTO VEHICLES WITH A FLASHLIGHT NEAR A LOCAL APARTMENT COMPLEX. WHILE CHECKING THE AREA, A SUBJECT WAS LOCATED AND FLED FROM OFFICERS. OFFICERS LOCATED THE SUBJECT'S VAN AND SET UP SURVEILLANCE ON THE VEHICLE. AFTER ABOUT A HALF HOUR, THE SUSPECT CAME BACK TO HIS VEHICLE AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. A NEARBY PONTIAC WAS LOCATED WITH THE DOOR AJAR IN THE AREA

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS PLANNING A NATIONAL NIGHT OUT AGAINST CRIME EVENT ON TUESDAY AUGUST 4, 2009. A SWAT TEAM DEMONSTRATION AND MANY OTHER ACTIVITIES ARE PLANNED.

THE SUSPECT WAS FIRST OBSERVED. THE DASHBOARD OF THE VEHICLE HAD BEEN PARTIALLY REMOVED AND A STEREO WAS MISSING. THE CONTENTS OF THE VEHICLE WERE SCATTERED THROUGHOUT THE CAR. THE VICTIM CONFIRMED SOMEONE HAD BROKEN INTO HER VEHICLE. THE SUSPECT ADMITTED TAKING THE STEREO AND TOLD OFFICERS WHERE TO RECOVER THE ITEMS TAKEN FROM THE CAR. THE STEREO WAS RECOVERED AND THE SUSPECT WAS CHARGED WITH FELONY BURGLARY.

OFFICERS NOVAK AND SZOLTYSIK WERE DISPATCHED TO A CRASH INVOLVING VEHICLES AND PEDESTRIANS. WHEN THEY ARRIVED AT A LOCAL RESIDENCE, THEY FOUND THAT THE OF-

FENDER HAD STRUCK A VEHICLE AND A PEDESTRIAN AND THEN FLED THE AREA. NO SERIOUS INJURY OCCURRED. OFFICERS CHECKED THE AREA AND THE DAMAGED VEHICLE WAS LOCATED BEHIND A BUSINESS IN HAZEL CREST. INFORMATION FROM THE VEHICLE LED TO THE DRIVER'S POSSIBLE IDENTITY. SHE HAD BEEN PICKED UP AND FLED TO HER RESIDENCE IN OAK FOREST. OAK FOREST POLICE TOOK THE OFFENDER INTO CUSTODY AND OFC. NOVAK THEN WENT TO OAK FOREST AND PLACED HER UNDER ARREST. SHE WAS CHARGED WITH LEAVING THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT AND MINOR IN CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL.

OFFICERS DRAKE AND CONROY WERE DISPATCHED TO THE SOUTH SUBURBAN COUNCIL ON ALCOHOLISM FOR A DISTURBANCE. UPON ARRIVING, THEY LEARNED THAT A PATIENT HAD CAUSED THE DISTURBANCE BY THREATENING TO INJURE ANOTHER RESIDENT. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH ASSAULT.

SGT. WASEK WAS TRAVELING ON HALSTED ST WHEN A VEHICLE APPROACHED AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED AND CAME WITHIN A FEW FEET OF STRIKING THE REAR OF THE SQUAD CAR. SGT. WASEK TOOK EVASIVE ACTION TO AVOID BEING STRUCK AND THEN INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP ON THE VEHICLE. THE DRIVER DID NOT HAVE A LICENSE WITH HIM AND BEFORE INFORMATION CAME BACK BY COMPUTER, SGT. WASEK RECEIVED AN EMERGENCY CALL AND CLEARED THE TRAFFIC STOP. AFTER THE CALL WAS FINISHED, IT WAS LEARNED THAT THE DRIVER HAD A VALID WARRANT FOR HIS ARREST FROM MARKHAM P.D. THE SUBJECT WAS LOCATED IN A NEARBY MOTEL AND TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. HE WAS RELEASED AFTER POSTING BOND FOR THE WARRANT.

OF. TULEY MADE A TRAFFIC STOP ON A VEHICLE FOR HAVING ONLY ONE HEADLIGHT OPERATING. UPON SPEAKING WITH THE DRIVER, OF. TULEY DETECTED A STRONG ODOR OF AN

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE EMITTING FROM HIS BREATH. THE DRIVER ATTEMPTED AND FAILED ALL FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS PLACED UNDER ARREST FOR DUI. AT THE STATION, HE TOOK A BREATH TEST WHICH INDICATED A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT (B.A.C.) OF .285. HE WAS CHARGED WITH IMPROPER LIGHTING, DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL AND HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08.

SGT. WASEK AND OF. SZOLTYSIK WERE DISPATCHED TO A DISTURBANCE WITH A FEMALE SUBJECT YELLING FOR SOMEONE TO CALL THE POLICE. WHEN THEY ARRIVED THEY FOUND THE FEMALE WITH A LACERATION OVER HER EYE. SHE HAD BEEN STRUCK BY HER HUSBAND CAUSING HER TO FALL AND HIT HER HEAD ON A CHAIR. THE OFFENDER LOCKED HIMSELF IN THE RESIDENCE AND OFFICERS TALKED HIM INTO SURRENDERING. HE CAME OUT OF THE HOUSE AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. HE WAS CHARGED WITH DOMESTIC BATTERY AND TRANSPORTED TO MARKHAM COURT.

OF. NOVAK WAS CONDUCTING A LATE NIGHT PREMISE CHECK ON A LOCAL MOTEL WHEN A FEMALE SUBJECT ENTERED THE BUILDING. SHE WALKED PAST THE DESK AND WAS QUESTIONED BY THE MANAGEMENT AS TO HER DESTINATION. SHE BECAME BELIGERANT WITH THE MANAGER WHEN TOLD SHE HAD TO WAIT IN THE LOBBY AND THEY WOULD CONTACT THE PARTY SHE WAS PLANNING TO VISIT. UPON CHECKING HER NAME, IT WAS LEARNED SHE HAD AN ACTIVE WARRANT FOR HER ARREST FROM THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. SHE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND LATER TRANSPORTED TO THE MARKHAM COURTHOUSE.

OF. TULEY STOPPED A SUSPICIOUS VEHICLE AFTER SEEING IT REPEATEDLY DRIVE AROUND THE SAME STREETS IN THE RESIDENTIAL AREA. THE DRIVER COULD SUPPLY NO LEGITIMATE EXPLANATION FOR HIS BEHAVIOR. A NAME CHECK REVEALED HE HAD AN ACTIVE WARRANT

OUT OF THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. HE WAS ARRESTED AND LATER TRANSPORTED TO THE MARKHAM COURTHOUSE.

OFC. DRAKE AND CHIEF ROBERTSON WERE DISPATCHED TO A RESIDENCE FOR A MAN THREATENING TO SHOOT A NEIGHBOR'S DOG. UPON ARRIVAL, THEY LEARNED THAT THE VICTIM'S DOG HAD ESCAPED HER GRIP AND RUN INTO THE OFFENDER'S YARD CHASING HIS CATS. IT WAS LEARNED THAT THE OFFENDER CARES FOR NUMEROUS CATS. THE VICTIM HAD RECAPTURED HER DOG AND RETURNED IT TO HER RESIDENCE. THE OFFENDER CAME OUT ONTO THE PORCH WITH A HANDGUN AND THREATENED TO SHOOT HER DOG. SHE AND HER DAUGHTER WERE FRIGHTENED BY HIS BEHAVIOR. THE OFFENDER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND CHARGED WITH DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND VIOLATION OF THE VILLAGE ANIMAL ORDINANCE.

THE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED NOTIFICATION

FROM THE STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE ON THE FOLLOWING CASES;

AN ARRESTEE OF OFFICER KRIS VALLOW HAD PLED GUILTY TO FELONY AGGRAVATED ROBBERY AND WAS SENTENCED TO 8 YEARS IN THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.

AN ARRESTEE OF OFC. GIANNINI PLED GUILTY TO A CHARGE OF POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE (COCAINE) AND WAS SENTENCED TO TWO YEARS OF PROBATION. THIS CASE HAS A VEHICLE AND CASH PENDING SEIZURE BY THE DEPARTMENT.

AN ARRESTEE OF OFC. KRIS VALLOW HAD STATE FELONY THEFT CHARGES SUPERCEDED BY FEDERAL CHARGES. THIS CASE LED TO THE DEPARTMENT SEIZING TWO VEHICLES. THE CASE INVOLVED OVER \$100,000.00 IN FRAUDULANTLY OBTAINED CELLULAR PHONES AND WAS TURNED OVER TO THE U.S. SECRET SERVICE WHO FILED THE ADDITIONAL FEDERAL CHARGES AGAINST THE DEFENDANT.

JUNE ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK

ON JUNE 19, OFFICERS CONDUCTED A ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK AT 174 AND WOOD FROM 8 PM - MIDNIGHT. THE ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK RESULTED IN 149 VEHICLES BEING DIRECTED INTO THE CHECKPOINT. SEVEN DRIVERS WERE CITED FOR DRIVER'S LICENSE VIOLATIONS, SEVEN FOR NO INSURANCE, ONE MARIJUANA ARREST AND THIRTEEN OTHER VIOLATIONS. ON A MORE POSITIVE NOTE NO DRIVERS WERE FOUND TO BE DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE. FUNDING FOR THE ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK COMES FROM AN ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT.

VOLUNTEERS FROM LYNWOOD, THORNTON AND SOUTH HOLLAND ESDA'S ALSO ASSISTED ON THE SAFETY CHECK.

JUNE INVESTIGATION REPORT

THE DETECTIVES HAVE RECEIVED 13 NEW CASES THIS MONTH INVOLVING BURGLARY, DAMAGE TO PROPERTY, DAMAGE TO VEHICLE, BURGLARY FROM VEHICLES, AND THEFTS. THROUGHOUT THE MONTH PREVIOUS CASES HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND FOLLOWED UP ON IN ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE NEW LEADS.

NEW COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY HAS ALLOWED US TO SEARCH FOR STOLEN ITEMS FROM PREVIOUS BURGLARIES AND THEFTS IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE THE PROPERTY AND IDENTIFY SUSPECTS.

THE SUPER 8 HOTEL REPORTED DAMAGE TO A TELEVISION IN ONE OF ITS ROOMS. A SUSPECT HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AND ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE HAVE BEEN MADE BUT WITH NO SUCCESS. A WARRANT FOR THE SUSPECTS ARREST IS BEING OBTAINED.

THE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED TWO REPORTS FROM THE SOUTH SUBURBAN COUNCIL REFERENCE THEFTS. BOTH THEFTS APPEAR TO BE RELATED AND ALL LEADS ARE BEING FOLLOWED UP ON. ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE A POSSIBLE SUSPECT ARE BEING MADE.

A THEFT FROM PUBLIC STORAGE WAS REPORTED THIS MONTH. A VEHICLE THAT WAS PARKED IN THE VERY BACK LOT FOR STORAGE HAD ITS WHEELS AND TIRES STOLEN FROM IT SOMETIME IN THE PAST MONTH. NO EXACT TIME OF THE THEFT IS YET KNOWN AND THERE ARE NO LEADS TO FOLLOW UP ON AT THIS TIME.

A VICTIM REPORTED THE THEFT OF AN EXTERIOR TRIM PANEL OF HER VEHICLE FROM THE METRA LOT. THE VICTIM ADVISED THAT THE PANEL COULD HAVE POSSIBLY BEEN MISSING A FEW DAYS. THERE WAS EVIDENCE THAT THE PANEL HAD BEEN MISSING A FEW DAYS AT THE TIME OF REPORT. NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A BURGLARY WAS REPORTED WHERE ENTRY WAS GAINED THROUGH AN UNLOCKED DOOR. EVIDENCE WAS RECOVERED AND ATTEMPTS TO LO-

CATE THE SUSPECTS ARE BEING MADE.

A BUSINESS REPORTED SEVERAL THEFTS FROM THE COMPANY VEHICLES THIS MONTH. VICTIM BELIEVES THE OFFENDER TO BE A EMPLOYEE OF THE BUSINESS BECAUSE THERE WAS NO DAMAGE DONE TO THE VEHICLES OR THE SECURITY GATE TO GAIN ACCESS TO THE PROPERTY THAT WAS TAKEN. DUE TO RECENTLY LETTING A NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES GO THE OWNER HAS NO IDEA WHO COULD HAVE CARRIED OUT THE THEFTS. THERE ARE NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A BURGLARY WAS REPORTED WERE THERE WAS NO SIGNS OF FORCED ENTRY INTO THE RESIDENCE. THE CASE IS BEING REVIEWED IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE ANY LEADS.

A MAILBOX FIRE WAS REPORTED. THE AREA WAS CANVASSED WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS. NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A VICTIM REPORTED THAT A SUBJECT HAD THROWN A BRICK THROUGH THE WINDOW OF HIS VEHICLE. THE OFFENDER IN THIS CRIME HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AND ATTEMPTS WERE MADE TO LOCATE BUT WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. A WARRANT IS BEING OBTAINED FOR THE ARREST OF THE OFFENDER.

THE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED A REPORT OF CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO A VEHICLE. THE VICTIM ADVISED THAT HER BOYFRIEND THREW AN UNKNOWN OBJECT AT THE REAR WINDOW OF HER VEHICLE CAUSING THE WINDOW TO BREAK. THE OFFENDER HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED, BUT THE VICTIM IS REFUSING TO PROSECUTE AT THIS TIME.

A VICTIM REPORTED AN UNKNOWN SUBJECT THREW A ROCK AT THE FRONT WINDOW OF THEIR RESIDENCE CAUSING THE WINDOW TO BREAK. NOBODY WAS LOCATED IN THE AREA AND NO LEADS EXSIST AT THIS TIME.

WITH ASSISTANCE FROM THE ILLINOIS STATE POLICE CRIME LAB THE SUSPECT IN A STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE CASE FROM LAST YEAR HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED. ATTEMPTS ARE BEING MADE TO LOCATE THE SUSPECT.

JUNE ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

ON JUNE 3 CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE NETWORK 3 QUARTERLY MEETING AT HOMEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT.

ON JUNE 4 & 5 WE HOSTED A LEADERSHIP SKILLS FOR STREET SUPERVISORS CLASS. SGT. WASEK ATTENDED THE TOW DAY TRAINING PROGRAM.

ON JUNE 8 WE WERE AUDITED BY THE ILLINOIS STATE POLICE LEADS STAFF. THE AUDIT COVERS NETWORK SECURITY, RECORD KEEPING AND A WIDE RANGE OF OTHER REQUIREMENTS. LEADS IS THE DATA SYSTEM USED TO ACCESS DRIVER INFORMATION, STORE WARRANT RECORDS, STOLEN PROPERTY RECORDS ETC. WE COMPLETED THE AUDIT WITH NO FINDINGS THANKS TO THE EXCELLENT RECORDS CAROL BOUQUET MAINTAINS.

ALSO ON JUNE 8 WE HOSTED A SEMINAR PUT ON BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF COOK COUNTY. CHIEF ROBERTSON HAD CONTACTED THE AUTHORITY OVER A VARIETY OF ISSUES LAW ENFORCEMENT ENCOUNTERS WITH HOUSING AUTHORITY CLIENTS. THE SEMINAR ADDRESSED THE WAYS IN WHICH LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE HOUSING AUTHORITY CAN WORK TOGETHER WITHIN OUR COMMUNITIES TO ADDRESS THESE PROBLEMS. IN ATTENDANCE WERE APPROXIMATELY 37 OFFICERS FROM 20 POLICE DEPARTMENTS.

CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE SOUTH SUBURBAN CHIEFS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING ON JUNE 18.

ON JUNE 22, CHIEF ROBERTSON, OFFICER DRAKE AND CAROL BOUQUET MET WITH THE

VILLAGE'S ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER ANGELO VITIRITTI TO DISCUSS IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW ORDINANCE. THE FIRST HEARING WILL BE HELD ON AUGUST 6. IN ADDITION CAROL BOUQUET ATTENDED SOUTH HOLLAND'S ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING WHERE ANGELO VITIRITTI ALSO SERVES AS HEARING OFFICER TO OBSERVE HOW THE HEARINGS ARE CONDUCTED.

OFFICER NOVAK ATTENDED THE MONTHLY SOUTH SUBURBAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM TRAINING ON JUNE 29 AND 30. HE ALSO RESPONDED TO A HOSTAGE BARRICADED SUBJECT SITUATION IN BURBANK ON JUNE 14

RED SPEED ILLINOIS OBTAINED INSTALLATION APPROVAL FROM THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE AUTOMATED RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT AT 171 AND HALSTED. THEY IMMEDIATELY FILED FOR PERMITS AND BOND SUBMITTAL. THEY ARE HOPEFUL CONSTRUCTION CAN BEGIN MID-LATE JULY AND THE SYSTEM BE OPERATIONAL WITHIN 2 WEEKS OF THE START OF CONSTRUCTION. RED SPEED IS WORKING ON PUBLIC AWARENESS MATERIALS INCLUDING POSTERS AND VIDEOS.

THE DEPARTMENT FILED NEW ASSET FORFEITURE SHARING CLAIM FORMS THROUGH THE ICE TASK FORCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$647,306.00 DURING THE MONTH.

PROSTITUTION STING TARGETING INTERNET ADVERTISING NETS 9 ARRESTS

ON 06/13/09 THE EAST HAZEL CREST POLICE DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED A STING OPERATION OF SUSPECTED PROSTITUTES THAT ARE ADVERTISING ON THE INTERNET. USING ROOMS FROM A LOCAL HOTEL THREE OFFICERS POSED AS CUSTOMERS AND CONTACTED SEVERAL SUSPECTED PROSTITUTES THAT HAD POSTED ADS ON THE CRAIG'S LIST WEBSITE. ALSO, ANOTHER SUSPECTED WEBSITE "EROS" THAT PROMOTES ITSELF AS AN "ESCORT LISTING" WAS TARGETED. DURING THE OPERATION, OFFICERS SUBSEQUENTLY ARRESTED FOUR PROSTITUTES THAT HAD ADVERTISED ON CRAIG'S LIST AND ONE PROSTITUTE THAT UTILIZED THE EROS WEBSITE. THREE PERSONS WERE ARRESTED AND ANOTHER BRIEFLY DETAINED FOR PIMPING IN RELATIONSHIP TO THE PROSTITUTION ARRESTS. IN ADDITION, 4 VEHICLES WERE SEIZED WITH A \$500 ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGE THAT WAS IMPLIMENTED TO DETER CERTAIN CRIMES SUCH AS PROSTITUTION, PIMPING, DRUGS AND WEAPONS.

WITHIN THE LAST FEW WEEKS THERE HAD BEEN MUCH PUBLICITY ABOUT CRAIG'S LIST AGREEING WITH THE ILLINOIS ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE TO STOP THE OBVIOUS PROSTITUTION ADVERTISEMENT BEING CONDUCTED ON THEIR WEBSITE. SINCE THIS DEPARTMENT ARRESTED THE MAJORITY OF THE PROSTITUTES THAT ADVERTISED ON CRAIG'S LIST, ALL REPORTS AND A SYNOPSIS WAS TURNED OVER TO THE ILLINOIS ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE FOR POSSIBLE FURTHER ACTION.
